



## EnterpriseOne Tools 9.1 Update 3 Enhancements

Editor's Note: Oracle continues the User Interface adventure with the release of the EnterpriseOne 9.1.3 UI. The 9.1 Tools Update 3 adds some great new features to an already robust 9.1 User Interface. ### Introduction

Many of the Tools 9.1.3 UI enhancements are optional, but are well worth consideration as there are several features that have the potential to significantly improve productivity or improve upon existing User Interface (UI) features. This article includes screenshots of every new feature from Update 3.

I'll be giving an overview of the new features, including:

- Hide/Show Tabs in the Carousel
- UDC Drop-down Menu
- Change Confirmation
- Shortcut Launcher
- Manage Media Objects Window
- Composite Application Framework (aka CAFÉ One)
- JDE on the iPad

This document covers new features for Tools 9.1 Update 3 (9.1.3) and for Applications 9.1. This document does not apply to World. Note that most of the new 9.1 UI features work with Applications 9.0, if you upgrade to Tools 9.1.

### Hide/Show Tabs in the Carousel

The Carousel, which is the new navigation tool that can sit on the left/right or top/bottom border of the page, has been updated to allow users to hide one or more of the main tabs (Open Applications, Recent Reports, and/or Favorites).

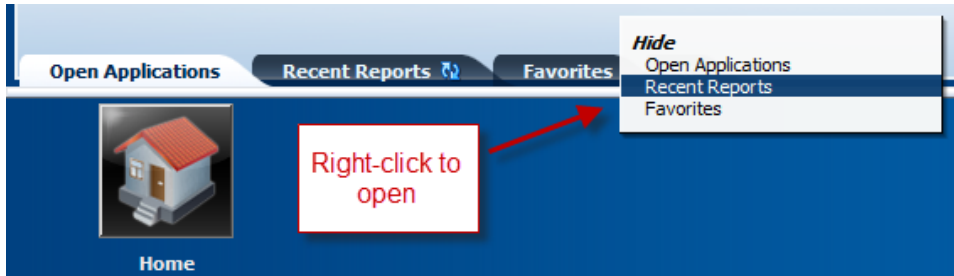


Figure 1: Hiding a Tab

To hide a tab, right-click on any tab and select the tab you would like to hide, as shown in Figure 1. Only two of the three tabs can be hidden.

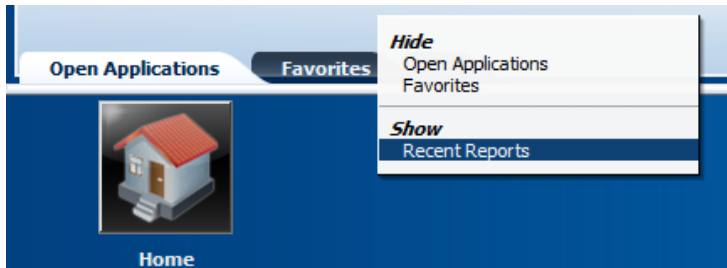


Figure 2: Showing a Tab

To unhide a tab, right-click over any tab and select the tab to Show, as shown in Figure 2. The updated tab settings will be automatically saved for the user.

## UDC Drop-down Menu

The UDC drop-down menu is a new feature that, if turned on for an application, replaces Visual Assist and Auto Suggest on all User Defined Code fields. Users can click on a drop-down button to view a list of available UDC codes for the field, as shown in Figure 3. Double-clicking on a code will select it.
